

Growing in Academics



Seton High School is proud to offer a rigorous and comprehensive college preparatory curriculum to our students. Through a combination of Honors, College Prep, Dual Credit and Advanced Placement courses, students can earn up to **86 college credits** while attending Seton. These college-level courses are offered on Seton's campus and on Mount St. Joseph University's campus. Seton's pathways to college and career success include courses and opportunities that focus on Business, Medicine & Health Sciences, Science and Technology, Engineering and Mechanics (STEM).

In addition, Seton's curriculum includes a Senior Capstone project. This is a culminating semesterlong research experience in which every student demonstrates the original thought, academic integrity and sound research principles required for success in college, careers and life. All students complete the Senior Capstone as part of their senior English class.

- 99% of our graduates continued their education in post-secondary programs
- 84% of our graduates received scholarships totaling \$28 million dollars
- 81% of our seniors are taking one or more dual credit or AP courses
- ACT test prep is available to all students
- Seton offers 13 Advanced Placement courses
- Seton offers 15 Dual Credit courses through Mount St. Joseph University
- Seton offers 21 college credits through the University of Cincinnati

HONORS PROGRAM

Admission to Seton's Honors Program requires a student to score in the top 15% on the High School Placement Test and demonstrate academic achievement, Christian leadership and service to others as evident by their admission essay. Students must have a grade school cumulative average of 85% with no grade below 78%. Once accepted into Seton's Honors Program, students are offered exclusive leadership workshops and training, ACT test prep, take part in unique service opportunities and engage in enrichment activities through partnerships with local universities.




