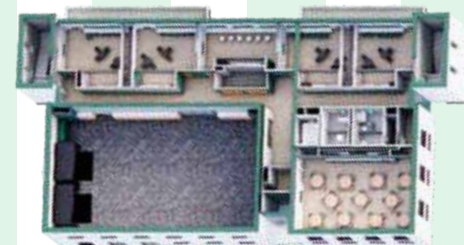

Seton High School is proud to offer a rigorous and comprehensive college preparatory curriculum to our students. Through a combination of Honors, College Prep, Dual Credit and Advanced Placement courses, students can earn up to **91 college credits** while attending Seton. These college-level courses are offered on Seton's campus and on Mount St. Joseph University's campus. Seton has partnered with TorchPrep to bring ACT **test prep training** to our students. Seton's **PATHWAYS** to college and career success include courses and opportunities that focus on **Business, Education, Medicine and Health Sciences, Science and Technology, Engineering** and **Mathematics (STEM)**.

In addition, Seton's curriculum includes a **Senior Capstone** project as a part of their senior English class. This is a culminating year-long research experience in which every student demonstrates the original thought, academic integrity and sound research principles required for success in college, careers and life.



HONORS PROGRAM

Admission to Seton's Honors Program requires a student to score in the top 15% on the High School Placement Test and demonstrate academic achievement, Christian leadership and service to others as evident by her admission essay. Students must have a grade school cumulative average of 85% with no grade below 78%. Once accepted into Seton's Honors Program, students are offered exclusive leadership workshops and training, ACT test prep, take part in unique service opportunities and engage in enrichment activities through partnerships with local universities.

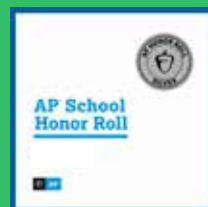

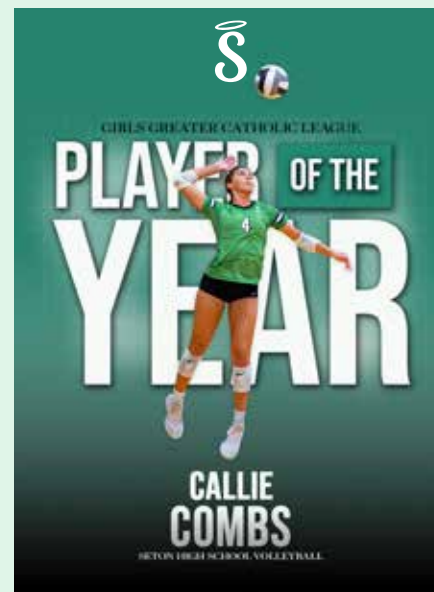

Study Seminar is a guided study hall designed to help students identified by the support services team who will benefit from additional support and guided assistance.

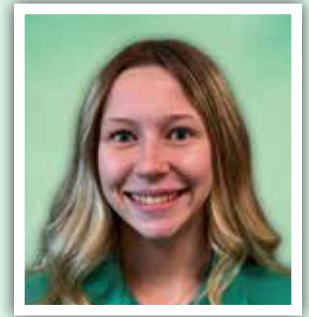

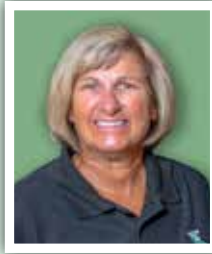
